## **Special Function Alcohol Management Policy**

This policy aims to provide a basis for the responsible use and/or non use of alcohol by the Glenelg Rebels Softball Club and is seen as fundamental to the aims of the club.

The club recognises that on occasions alcohol may be served at special functions. The Marion Sports and Community Club manages the licensed premises that maybe used for these functions and as such the Glenelg Rebels Softball Club will uphold and adhere to the liquor licensing laws and the policies of the Marion Sports and Community Club.

To ensure the aims of the club are upheld, and that alcohol is managed responsibly by the club and its members, the following requirements will apply when alcohol is served at club special functions.

### **Serving Alcohol**

Alcohol will be served according to the legal and moral requirements of the Marion Sports and Community Club's Liquor License with the safety and well being of patrons the priority.

The Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Inc will actively support all aspects of the Marion Sports and Community Clubs Alcohol Management Policy in respect to the responsible service of alcohol.

### **Intoxicated Patrons / Underage Drinking**

**The following will be applied to all members and visitors at any special functions under the control of the Glenelg Rebels Softball Club:**

- Alcohol will not be served to any person who is intoxicated or drunk
- Servers will follow RSA training procedures when refusing service
- Drunk patrons will be asked to leave the premises
- Alcohol will not be served to persons aged under 18
- Servers and committee members will ask for proof of age whenever necessary or whenever in doubt
- Only photo ID's will be accepted

### **Alcohol Alternatives**

The Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Inc will ensure at licensed functions that non alcohol alternatives are for sale and that tap water can be provided free of charge on request.

The club will also avoid player prizes and raffle prizes that have an emphasis on alcohol.

### **Safe Transport**

The Club has a (separate) Safe Transport Policy that is reviewed regularly in conjunction with the Alcohol Management Policy.

### **Non Compliance**

All club committee members will enforce the alcohol management policy and any non-compliance, particularly in regard to Licensing Laws will be handled according to the following process:

- Explanation of the club policy to the person/people concerned, including identification of the section of policy not being complied with
- Continued non-compliance with the policy should be handled by at least two committee members who will use their discretion as to the action taken, which may include asking the person/ people to leave the club facilities or function

The club will monitor and ensure any club trips, particularly end of season player trips, strictly adhere to responsible behaviour and alcohol consumption in accordance with the principles of this policy and the aims of the club Mission and Values Statement.

### **Policy Promotion**

The club will promote the alcohol management policy regularly by:

- Publishing a copy of the policy in club newsletters, league programs and printed member/ player information
- Displaying a copy of the policy in the club social rooms
- Periodic announcements to members at functions

The club recognises the importance of educating club members, particularly players in the benefits of implementing an alcohol management policy and will endeavour to provide information to assist this process.

The club will actively participate in the Australian Drug Foundation Good Sports Accreditation Program with an ongoing priority to maintain Level 0 accreditation.

### **Policy Review**

To ensure this policy continues to be relevant for club operation and that it reflects both community expectations and the provisions of the Liquor Control Reform Act, the policy will be reviewed annually.

## Safe Transport Policy

The Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Incorporated recognises that on occasions alcohol may be served at special functions and that as a club we are responsible for the safety of our members. In doing so the club shall ensure our members are aware of this policy and are encouraged to make alternative transport arrangements when consuming alcohol at such functions.

**The Marion Sports and Community Club is the management for the premises, which Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Inc utilize and is the sole body undertaking responsible bar duties and serving alcohol according to the legal and moral requirements of that club's Liquor License with the safety and well being of patrons the priority.**

In addition, the GRSC shall:

- Encourage members and visitors to make alternate safe transport arrangements if they are considered to exceed .05 blood alcohol concentration
- Telephone calls will be made free of charge to arrange a taxi or other transport through the event coordinator
- Contact telephone numbers for taxi services will be displayed clearly at the MSCC

### Policy Promotion

The club will promote the safe transport policy by:

- Publishing a copy of the policy on the website (<http://glenelgrebels.softball.org.au>), in club newsletters, and printed member/player information
- Displaying a copy of the policy in the club change/storage rooms.

The club recognises the importance of educating club members, particularly players and the benefits of implementing a safe transport policy and will endeavour to provide information to assist this process.

The club will actively participate in the Australian Drug Foundation Good Sports program with an ongoing priority to maintain Level Zero accreditation.

## **Smoke Free Policy**

The Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Incorporated recognises that passive smoking is hazardous to health and those non-smoking club members and visitors have the right to be protected from exposure to tobacco smoke.

Accordingly, the following policy shall apply to all club facilities, functions, meetings and activities undertaken by the club and will apply to all members, officials, players and club visitors.

### **Facilities**

All club facilities within the control of the Club are to be completely smoke free and shall include:

- The meeting room, toilets and storage area
- Player change rooms inclusive of warm up area, toilets and showers, and property room

Cigarettes will not be sold (including vending machines) at any time at or by the club.

### **Players, Officials & Coaches**

Coaches, players, trainers, volunteers and officials will refrain from smoking and remain smoke free while involved in an official capacity for the club, both during training and playing commitments.

### **Functions**

The Marion Sports and Community Club is the management for the premises which Glenelg Rebels Softball Club Inc utilize. The club has designated smoking and non-smoking areas within the facility.

All outside club functions including social and fund raising events and meetings are to be designated as smoke free within the areas under our control:

- Ashtrays will not be provided within the club function rooms.
- Cigarette butt bins will be provided at outdoor locations for smokers to dispose of cigarette butts before entering/ re-entering smoke free areas at club facilities

In the event that a venue other than the GRSC home venue is utilized – the same requirements will be applied.

Promotional material will indicate the involvement with Good Sports and the implications as a smoke free supporter.

### **Non-compliance**

All club committee members will endeavour to enforce the smoke free policy and any non-compliance will be handled according to the following process:

- Explanation of the club policy to the person/people concerned, including identification of the areas in which smoking is permitted
- Continued non-compliance with the policy should be handled by at least two committee members who will use their discretion as to the action taken, which may include asking the person/ people to leave the club facilities or function
